The General Assembly,

Having considered the reports of the Special Committee on the Policies of
Apartheid of the Government of the Republic of South Africa (A/5497 and Add.1-2),
Recalling Assembly resolutions 1761 (XVII) of 6 November 1962 and 1881 (XVIII)
of 11 October 1963 on the policies of apartheid of the Government of the Republic
of South Africa,

Taking note of resolutions S/5386 and S/5471 adopted by the Security Council
on 7 August 1963 and 4 December 1963 respectively,

1. Appeals to all States to implement the resolutions of the General
Assembly and the Security Council on the policies of apartheid of the Government
of the Republic of South Africa;

2. Notes with appreciation the reports of the Special Committee on the
Policies of Apartheid of the Government of the Republic of South Africa, and

requests it to continue to follow the various aspects of this question constantly and to submit reports to the General Assembly and the Security Council whenever necessary;

3. Requests all States to take appropriate measures on the basis of the recommendations of the Special Committee with a view to dissuading the South African Government from pursuing its policies of apartheid, and to intensify their efforts, jointly and severally, towards that end;

4. Requests the Secretary-General to furnish the Special Committee with all the necessary means for the effective accomplishment of its task;

5. Invites the specialized agencies and all Member States to give the Special Committee their assistance and co-operation in the fulfilment of its mandate.
